The German battlecruisers (Hipper) escaped from the British battlecruiser squadron (Beatty). TARANTO was the first action between two battle fleets in which the ships concerned never saw each other. British aircraft from the carriers HMS ILLUSTRIOUS and EAGLE made a night attack on the Italian Fleet at Taranto, sank one battleship and damaged two others.

Admiral Thomas Lord Cochrane (1775-1860) who fought in the Napoleonic Wars in the Royal Navy, then led the Chilean Navy during Chile's struggle for independence from Spain (1818-1820), led the Brazilian Navy in Brazil's struggle against Portugal in 1822, and finally fought with the Greeks against the Turks in the mid-1820's. His name was honored by the Chilean battleship ALMIRANTE COCHRANE which was building in England in 1914 and subsequently became the carrier HMS EAGLE. Many of the events in Lord Cochrane's career served as the basis for exploits of C. S. Forester's Captain Horatio Hornblower.
9. a) USS SAILFISH - changed for morale reasons after accidental loss of SQUALUS. b) Egyptian MOHAMED ALI EL KHEBIR captured by ISRAELI. c) USS SAN MARCOS - ship reclassified from BB to target ship to allow use of name for new BB. d) GENERAL ALEXEIEV - ship changed hands from Bol sheviks to White Russians. e) MANASSAS - ship converted from tug boat to armored ram. f) GENERAL ADMIRAL APRAXINE - captured by Japanese at Battle of Tsushima. g) Chinese YAT SEN - captured by the Japanese. i) German PILLAU - to Italy as war reparations. j) GENERAL BELGRANO - name changed for political reasons when Argentine dictator Juan Peron was overthrown.
10. Although a number of submarines were sunk by aircraft bombs in WW I, the first confirmed sinking of a surface warship was USS PANAY sunk by Japanese planes in Dec. 1937 on the Tangtze River.
